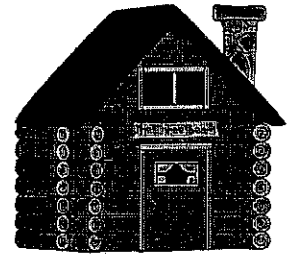


Goldilocks Board Game



Can you help Goldilocks find the bear's house?

Setting: Small Group

Objective: Counting, building number sense, 1:1 correspondence

Materials Needed:

- Playing pieces- you can use colored Unifix cubes or any other small manipulative that is available in a variety of colors.
- Foam die **or** use the printable die included on pages 18 or 19

Information:

This game is simple yet allows practice for counting, building number sense, and one-to-one correspondence. Students roll the die and move their playing piece the correct number of spaces. Choose the die that best meets the needs of your students, the die on page 18 is a traditional die with 1-6 dots and the die on page 19 has only 1-3 dots.

With young children it is better not to have too many "rules" or actions in a board game. Missing a turn and moving backwards or forwards when landing on a space can be confusing and frustrating. Once children become familiar with the concept of board games these concepts can be introduced.

This board game is one page so if your students are not ready to play a group board game you can give them each their own board and allow them to play individually.

Directions:

Give each player a playing piece. Players take turns rolling the die and moving their playing piece towards the three bear's house.

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
